#### i. Van-Mahotsava - A tree plantation drive.

The college has adopted an exercise to contribute substantially in the direction of environmentenrichment. A step to counter balance the evils of deforestation and also to inculcate environmental awareness among the students, the college conducted a special drive, "Van-Mahotsava". #### ii) Shahid-Smruti Din

The college is located at the same sacred place where six patriots have sacrificed their lives in the Indian Freedom Movement of 1942. To cherish the memories of the supreme sacrifice of the martyrs, the college has organised "Shahid-Smruti Din" on 27 July 2017 on the occasion of "Nagpanchami". This special programme to pay rich tribute to the martyrs was presided over by shri. Bhashkarrao Thakare, the eminent freedom fighter. Hon'ble Shaileshji Nawal, the district Collector, Hon'ble Puranji Meshram, Head Dept. Of Marathi, R.T.M. Nagpur University, Miss. Smitatai Gajabhiye, Tahsildar Ashti, the president and the secretary of the parent body were the chief guests of the programme.

Apart from paying rich tribute to the memory of the martyrs, the parent body and the college has initiated their efforts to establish an Inspiration Centre by constructing the memorial of the martyrs. The ceaseless efforts of the institutions have culminated into partial success and the state government has announced the action plan and released some fund in this regard to preserve the memories of the martyrs of 1942 freedom movement.
